The City Planning Commission will conduct a public hearing regarding proposed amendments to Sections 12.03, 12.19, 12.20, and 12.24 of the Los Angeles Municipal Code to establish Alternative Technology facility standards. Alternative technologies, the next generation of recycling, converts municipal solid waste, which now goes to landfills, to renewable energy, chemicals or products. The Council motions direct staff to prepare standards and criteria for the development of proposed alternative technology facilities.

If you challenge this matter in court, you may be limited to those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described here, or in written correspondence on the matter delivered to this agency at or prior to the public hearing.
