## **L.A. CITY ATTORNEY ROCKY DELGADILLO SECURES 270 DAY JAIL SENTENCE FOR MAN FOUND IN POSSESSION OF CHILD PORNOGRAPHY**

**LOS ANGELES** – Los Angeles City Attorney Rocky Delgadillo today announced his office has secured a 270-day jail sentence for a Los Angeles man found in possession of child pornography on his computer and camera.

Guy Cornwell, 39, was convicted of one count of possession of child pornography and 11 counts of the creation and duplication of child pornography following more than two years of litigation and a six day jury trial including expert testimony from eight United States Secret Service Agents and officers from the LAPD Sexually Exploited Child Unit and Internet Crimes Against Children Unit.

Judge Mary Lou Villar sentenced Cornwell to four years of probation and 270 days in County Jail. Cornwell was also ordered to register as a sex offender and is not allowed to access or own a camera or computer equipment during the term of probation. In addition, Cornwell was ordered to attend 52 counseling sessions for sexual deviant behavior.

In 2005 Cornwell, a delivery employee at the Best Buy store in West Los Angeles, brought his computer into the store for repairs. The technician at the store noted a nervous behavior from Cornwell and ultimately discovered images of child pornography on the computer. A copy of the computer files were turned over to the United States Secret Service for investigation.

Testimony at the trial also noted that Cornwell often carried his camera to work and would take inappropriate photographs of minor children and display them to others.

Results of the investigation were forwarded to City Attorney Delgadillo's Criminal and Special Litigation Branch for prosecution by Deputy City Attorney Michele Anderson of the Consumer Fraud and Enforcement Unit.
