**UPDATE ON METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY
(MTA) STRIKE**

The following excerpts are from a letter addressed to the Heads of City Departments from Mayor Richard J. Riordan. Please review and ascertain the impact a strike will have on program participants.

Many of your clients rely upon public transportation to commute to and from their places of employment. Please contact your participants to ensure that alternate arrangements for transportation have been made.

"In the event of a strike, the following MTA service changes will be in effect:

1. No MTA rail service, i.e. Red Line, Blue Line, Green Line.
2. No rapid bus service.
3. No regular MTA bus service-express, limited, local, shuttle.
4. Limited MTA bus service on the following 5 lines:
 - 21 (Wilshire)
 - 30 (Pico)
 - 60 (Long Beach Boulevard)
 - 204 (Vermont)
 - 420 (Panorama City, Van Nuys-Hollywood)
5. Municipal bus lines (LADOT, Foothill, Santa Monica, Long Beach, etc.) should all be operating normally.
6. Metrolink should be operating normally.

Anyone who uses MTA transit (rail and/or bus) should consider having back-up transportation plans and make allowances for significantly increased traffic congestion throughout Los Angeles County and longer commutes".
