

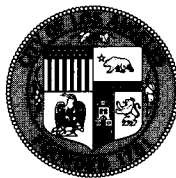

ECIS Project

ECIS is the East Central Interceptor Sewer and will be built along an 11-mile route from downtown to Culver City. ECIS is currently the largest public works construction project in the City of Los Angeles and is needed to provide hydraulic relief for the existing 75-year-old North Outfall Sewer (NOS), which has experienced structural deterioration.

The City of Los Angeles entered into a project labor agreement with contractors and unions which ensures that 40% of the ECIS labor workforce come from a 3-mile radius of the project. Attached is a listing of zip codes included in the labor agreement, which sets up the geographical boundaries from where the contractors and unions will seek construction workers. The likely jobs will be in these areas:

- Laborers
- Electricians
- Carpenters
- Truckers

Ten percent of the community residents hired for skilled positions must be classified as underemployed, "at-risk". The following criteria will be used to identify the "at-risk" worker:

- Household income below 50% of the median
- Homeless
- Welfare Recipient
- History of involvement with the justice system
- Unemployed
- Single Parent

The Department of Public Works is managing the ECIS project. Public Works set up a toll-free number, (866) 711-1115, to field ECIS inquiries, including job opportunities. Public Works hotline staff will screen callers. If there appears to be a good match between the caller's skills and ECIS-related employment, the caller will be referred to the union. All other employment related calls will be referred to One-Stop Career Centers.
