Subject: **WIA DIRECTIVE No. 02-41**
INDIVIDUAL TRAINING ACCOUNTS

In response to a renewed emphasis on providing training activities for WIA customers, who are determined to be in need of such services, there has been an overwhelming increase in ITA expenditures. This has resulted in the City having to augment the existing Adult ITA account. Recent reports from the South Bay WIB indicate a need for a transfer of even more adults funds to support operations through June 30, 2002. To ensure that the account remains adequately funded through the end of the program year, the City is taking the following, immediate action:

1. Requests for waiver to the \$5,200 and \$7,500 ITA caps will no longer be honored.
2. Consistent with the WIA Regulations, Adult ITAs shall now be restricted to low income individuals (see attached).

These guidelines shall remain in effect through June 30, 2002. For PY 2002-2003 individual WorkSource Center ITA caps will be negotiated and incorporated into agreements.

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

Subject: WIA DIRECTIVE NO. 02-03
PY 2000/2001 70% LOWER LIVING STANDARD INCOME (LLSIL) LEVEL AND
POVERTY INCOME GUIDELINES

This Directive transmits the PY 2001 70% Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) Guidelines recently published by the Secretary of Labor in the Federal Register on May 9, 2001, and 2001 Poverty Guidelines published by the federal department of Health and Human Services (HHS) February 16, 2001. It supersedes LA City WIA Directive 00-47 dated June 28, 2000.

The Workforce Investment Act (WIA), provides for the use of two sets of data to establish whether an individual is a low-income individual. The specific measure used in determining this status is the **higher** of either the Poverty Guideline or the 70% LLSIL.

POVERTY GUIDELINES AND 70% LLSIL - 6 MONTH INCOME
