OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

with Huell Howser



This month, Huell travels to the northeast section of the San Fernando Valley to the beautifully modest towns of Sunland and Tujunga, which is a Shoshone Indian word, meaning, “place of the old woman” or “mother earth.” Upon his journey, he learns that in the early 1900’s, the land in Tujunga had been advertised to incoming settlers as small plots of land with a large supply of river rock with which to construct homes. Sunland is widely known for its vast orchards and is also the original location of the Sunland Olive Company, which has since moved to Porterville, but has retained the “Sunland” name. Huell stops first at the Bolton Hall Museum, built in 1913 entirely from river rock, and number two on the list of the most historic sites in the City of Los Angeles, where almost all the town’s events were held, and where events are still held today. Huell also saunters over to the McGroarty Arts Center in Tujunga, originally built for a wealthy congressman, also constructed from river rock, and today is used for piano, dance, and ceramic classes, among other art-related activities. Huell concludes this sixth episode of **Our Neighborhoods** in the backyard of Sunland/Tujunga, in the beautiful San Gabriel Mountains. Making a Literary Life: Advice for Writers and Other Dreamers – “Be discrete. Be secretive.”

This is **Carolyn See’s** advice to would-be writers: don’t talk about your dream of writing. No one wants to hear about it. Gossip, snippets of autobiography, goofy examples of concerns such as points of view and plot, weird confessions, and reasonable and unrealistic expectations all jumble together in See’s

hectic yet shrewd, revealing yet maddening how-to book, bound to intrigue aspiring writers. **October 5**

This month, Connie Martinson meets with TWO authors in this new half hour episode of “Talks Books.”

The Devil’s Redhead – San Francisco private investigator for more than a decade, **David Corbett** brings a wealth of real-world detail to his swift, highly atmospheric narrative about ex-con, Dan Abatangelo’s readjustment to freedom and his efforts to reunite with former lover, Shel Beaudry. When Shel is taken hostage during a local drug war, Abatangelo responds with a daring rescue mission that takes him deep into his former world and ignites a gruesome chain of violence and death.

Running with Scissors – The true story of a boy whose mother gave him away to be raised by her psychiatrist. Suddenly, at age twelve, **Augusten Burroughs** found himself living with the doctor’s bizarre family, a few patients, and a pedophile living in the backyard shed. It turns foul and harrowing, compelling and maniacally funny, but above all, it chronicles an ordinary boy’s survival under the most extraordinary circumstances.

October 8

The Real McCoy – **Darin Strauss** recounts the life of a legendary drifter, in this deadpan comic and grandly imaginative novel. Strauss tells the story of Virgil Selby, or “Kid” McCoy, who after witnessing the death of a small-time boxer named McCoy, adopts his name and reputation and leaves his Indiana home to achieve renown. McCoy befriends con man Jonnie Gold, who teaches McCoy the twist fist fighting style. McCoy soon departs for New York City, where he uses his newfound trickery to conquer the boxing world, marry a Broadway starlet, and become a minor celebrity. **October 9**

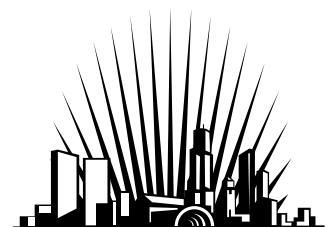

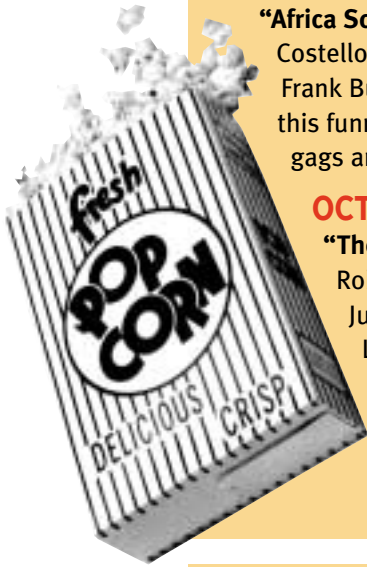
