REYES ANNOUNCES \$50,000 REWARD IN SLAYING OF 19-YEAR-OLD *– City Council Unanimously Reinstates Reward on Birthday of Slain Teen*

The City Council, at the request of Councilmember Ed P. Reyes, unanimously reinstated a reward today for information leading to the arrests of those involved in the January 31, 2004 shooting death of 19-year-old Sean Williams. The \$50,000 reward was approved today, on the birthday of the slain teen.

“Our hearts and prayers are with the family and friends of Sean Williams, especially during this difficult time of year,” Reyes said. “I urge anyone with information about the murder to please come forward and give the family some peace of mind.”

The homicide occurred at about 1 a.m. in the 500 block of Avenue 28 in the Los Angeles Community of Cypress Park, according to police reports. Three Hispanic men drove alongside Williams’ car and began shooting at him. The teen lost control of his vehicle and crashed into a building.

Williams lived in Eagle Rock and his family is from Cypress Park. Williams worked at The Cheesecake Factory in Pasadena for two years and was described by his co-workers as a dedicated employee.

LAPD Northeast Area Homicide detectives are investigating the murder. So far, a motive for the shooting has not been identified and no suspects have been apprehended.
