## **GARCETTI ANNOUNCES PUBLIC STORAGE TO PROVIDE PUBLIC SPACE**

*EAGLE ROCK BOULEVARD FACILITY TO HOUSE FIELD OFFICE AND COMMUNITY CENTER*

Councilmember Garcetti won unanimous council approval of a new community space and council field office at Public Storage Inc.'s Eagle Rock Boulevard facility in Glassell Park, capping a community negotiations process that joined advocates and corporate citizens to win a much-needed public facility in Glassell Park.

"Today's achievement sets a new standard for what developers and community members can accomplish by working together," said Councilmember Garcetti, whose office worked with all parties to win the community space. "Public Storage and Glassell Park make a great team."

The new space is approximately 7500 square feet, and will include a senior community room and kitchen, a field office for council staff to use to serve the community, and a large general-use community space. In addition, Public Storage will make approximately 40 parking spaces available for use in connection with the community space.

"The Glassell Park Community Room at Public Storage gives the Glassell Park Improvement Association, the Glassell Park Neighborhood Council and the Seniors Club a much-needed venue to hold regular general membership and planning meetings," said George Brauckman, a member of the Board of Directors of the Glassell Park Improvement Association. "The schools, churches, and Recreation Center in Glassell Park have been wonderfully hospitable all these years offering us a place to meet, but it will be fabulous to have a place of our own."

"Public Storage has had a presence in Eagle Rock for the last 25 years, providing storage spaces to meet the needs of the individual. We are very pleased that the consensus-building effort led by the council office resulted in an outcome that benefits both the Glassell Park community and Public Storage," said Harvey Lenkin, President of Glendale-based Public Storage, Inc. "We look forward to being an involved member of the Glassell Park community for years to come."
