


MOTION

The Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD) has identified ten Kawasaki KZ 1000 patrol motorcycles as surplus this year with the intention of replacing them through the City of Los Angeles' on-going vehicle replacement program. Be advised that the criteria established for donation of surplus city equipment memorialized in Ordinances No. 173801 and 174423 shall not be applicable to the proposed donations insofar as the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) is a governmental agency and therefore exempt from these provisions pursuant to Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 22.547(b)(3). The LAPD's Motor Transport Division (MTD) intends to donate these surplus assets to the LAUSD for use by its police department consistent with the City's effort to support public interest organizations that provide beneficial service to the community. This surplus equipment will assist LAUSD in maintaining safety and security for its students and faculty.

I THEREFORE MOVE that, the City Council:

1. Authorize the sale and transfer of ten Kawasaki KZ 1000 patrol motorcycles for \$1.00 each to the Los Angeles Unified School District for use by its police department.
2. Find that the sale and transfer of the aforementioned surplus equipment is consistent with the City's effort to support public interest organizations that provide a service to the community, fulfill a humanitarian purpose, are of benefit to the City and that the City is receiving adequate compensation for the equipment in question.
3. Request the City Attorney and Los Angeles Police Department to expedite preparation of the appropriate documents to effectuate the transfer of the above identified surplus equipment at below market value to the Los Angeles Unified School District for use by its police department, and to notify the Councilmember of the Third District.
4. Instruct the City Clerk to inform the Los Angeles Unified School District that the surplus equipment must be claimed within 60 days from the date of Council approval of the request, at which time the vehicles will revert to the City's surplus equipment pool for disposal by the Department of General Services.
